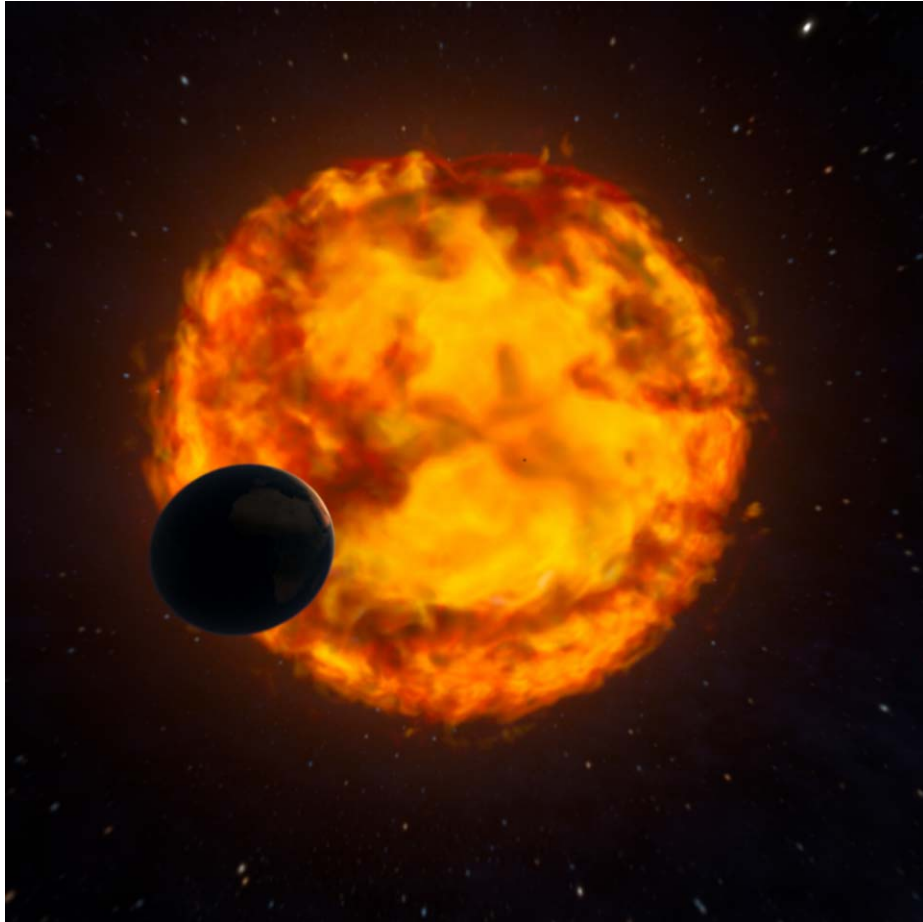

JOURNEY TO THE STARS



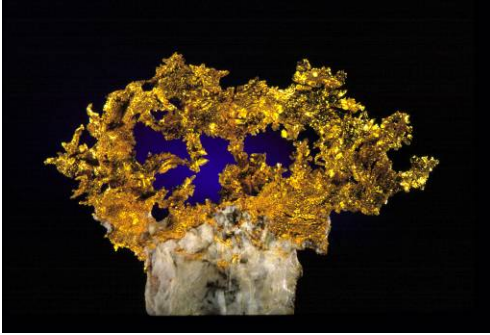

Lizards and Snakes: Alive!

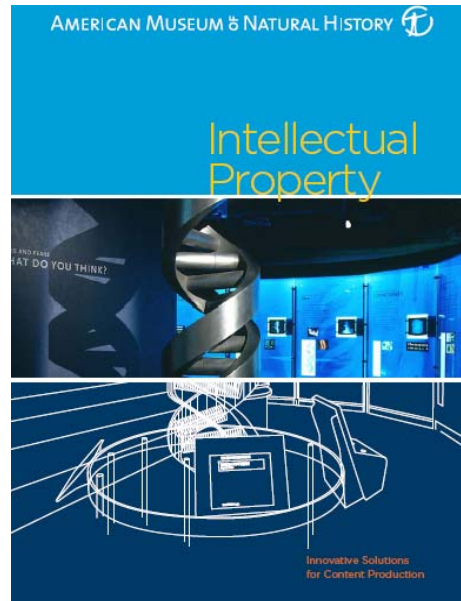

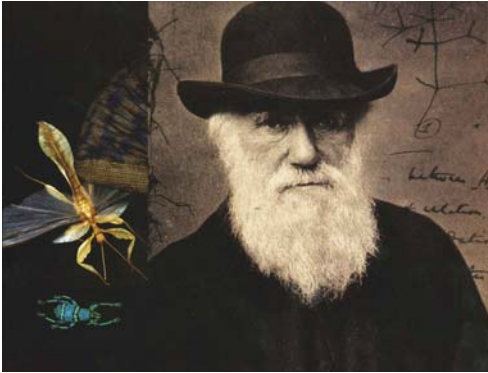
Use intellectual property to:

Intellectual property packages contain:

- Design drawings for exhibition furniture and interactive exhibitry
- Graphic panel production files and licensed images
- Exhibition text
- Master files for media components and exhibition videos
- Production files for computer interactives
- Audio-visual equipment list
- Artifact, specimen, model and object list
- Installation guide with detailed images,

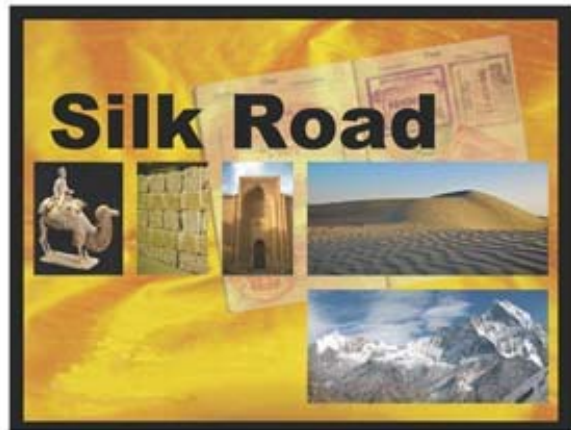
